MAC gets third PNC Arts Alive Grant

For the third year in a row, we are privileged to receive a \$35,000 grant through the **PNC Arts Alive** initiative to help underwrite our signature cultural offering, the **2012 Cape May Music Festival**. MAC was one of only a handful of arts organizations in Southern New Jersey to be selected for our bold efforts to increase arts access and engagement.

Through the PNC Arts Alive grant, MAC will continue our audience development project for the Music Festival, targeting new audiences, including school-age children, young adults and adults age 55 and over. The programming initiatives include classroom residency activities, outreach to senior centers and adult living communities and nightclub programs, all in advance of the mainstage concerts. In hopes of boosting audience attendance, discount coupons will be distributed to reduce admission prices.

“The PNC Foundation has a long history of providing grants to non-profit organizations that strengthen and enrich the lives of our neighbors,” said **Bill Mills**, regional president of PNC for Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey. “We understand the valuable return that investing in the arts can deliver. Today more than ever, the businesses we attract, the jobs we create and the visitors who extend their stay are drawn by what the Greater Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey region has to offer.”

MAC receives a “Trenton Haircut”

In Trenton lingo, whenever a program's budget gets cut a little (but not a lot), it's said to have received a “haircut.” That's the position that MAC found ourselves in when we received our latest grant awards from the **New Jersey Historical Commission** and the **New Jersey State Council on the Arts** (both in the **Department of State**). Like virtually every other history and art organization in the state, we received a relatively modest (less than \$30,000) cut in state funding. The \$275,218 that we've been awarded by the Historical Commission will provide ongoing general operating support for our three historic sites and our community history tours and events. The \$54,437 that we've been awarded by the Arts Council will help underwrite our signature cultural program, the 2012 **Cape May Music Festival**. While any cut is painful during these difficult times, we are mindful that it's little short of a miracle that we (like most New Jersey cultural organizations) have salvaged more than 90% of our state

funding, at a time when arts and history budgets are being decimated around the country. For their continued support of the Historical Commission and Arts Council budgets, we wish to thank Governor **Chris Christie**, Lt. Governor **Kim Guadagno**, the New Jersey Legislature (especially our 1st District team of Senator **Jeff Van Drew** and Assemblymen **Nelson Albano** and **Matt Milam**), as well as our statewide advocacy organizations, the **Advocates for New Jersey History and Art Pride New Jersey**.

MAC's Spring Education Wrap-up

In June, we completed the series of outreach programs funded by **PNC Arts Alive**. We were able to take **McDermott's Handy** (**Kathy DeAngelo** and **Dennis Gormley**) to four schools to provide programs on traditional Irish music for 530 students. The same funding allowed us to take **Babatunde Lea's** program of Afro-Brazilian music to four schools serving 760 students.

We were happy to welcome **Special Services School** to the group of school served by the grant. Music teacher **Eric Simonson** was instrumental in opening their doors for us. Thanks to Activity Director **Rita Powers**, we also visited **Victorian Towers** and **Haven House** during the outreach program.

While not your traditional outreach venues but still in the category of audience development, **McDermott's Handy** played at the **Mad Batter** and **Babatunde** jammed at the **Merion Inn** on jazz night with **George Messterhazy**, **Tim Lekan** and **Bob Shomo**.

After spending the winter carrying out our song-writing project, composer **Eliot Bailen** got to work on orchestrating the piece we had hoped to perform on May 26 for the **Young People's Concert**. Choir Directors **Sandy Beane-Fox** and **Julie Heck** were ready to whip their kids into shape and Band Director **John Drechen** was looking forward to an expanded band presence in the ensemble.

Unfortunately, timing of state-mandated testing forced us to postpone our **Young People's Concert**. The good news is that, thanks to the assistance of principal **Joe Castellucci** and Director of Curriculum and Instruction **Chris Kobik**, we will offer the concert on November 2 at Lower Cape May Regional High School's auditorium.

We honored Mayor Ed for his eloquent championing, at both the state and local levels, of cultural heritage tourism and for his lead role in the construction of the new Cape May Convention Hall.

Eliot worked with five schools writing the songs that tell the story of "Band," a take on the popular TV show "Glee," about the lives of high school kids involved in the arts. It will be a real showcase of the talents of the students.

The **Cape May Lighthouse** continued to be the most popular field trip destination this Spring though we also provided in-school programs and hosted students at the **Physick Estate** and on **Trolley Tours**. For the period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011, we provided programs for more than 10,000 students.

We finished the Spring series of **Road Scholar** (formerly **Elderhostel**) programs on June 17. Overall, the **Victorian Primer** program proved to be our most popular, but we also offered **Birding**, **Watercolor**, **Maritime** and **Culinary** programs. The groups here during the Music Festival were delighted by the opportunity to attend concerts as extra-curricular activities. One of our long-time watercolor instructors, **Marge Chavooshian**, was forced to withdraw from the June program due to illness but our other favorite instructor, **Barbara Cox**, stepped in and we rescued that program. A total of 246 participants enjoyed our 11 Spring programs.

While the **Road Scholar** and in-school programs and field trips were going on, we also provided a variety of programs for group tours arranged by Group Tour Manager **Sue Gibson** and as well as for community groups, including a few visits to the **Ocean City Historical Museum** and a trip to the **Zwaanendael Museum** in Lewes, DE.

FROM THE DIRECTOR

A tribute to Bill

By the time this newsletter reaches you, we will have said a sad goodbye to one of MAC's largely unsung heroes, **Bill Ten Eyck**. Since he joined the MAC staff in February 1995, Bill has had a truly transformative impact on the organization, as he rose from Assistant Director to Deputy Director to Chief Operating Officer (since 2006). Bill's responsibilities have grown to encompass most of MAC's internal operations, including all of our tours, most of our special events, visitor services, maintenance, retail, information technology and the Tearoom. Through his six direct reports, Bill has supervised the lion's share of MAC's paid staff (about 135 of our 150 staffers), while also working closely with many Board Members and volunteers. As he takes an early retirement to move to Florida, Bill's 16½ years at MAC have left an enduring legacy in at least three key areas:

Teamwork. Bill helped propel an incipient move to create cross-departmental teams into a full-blown network of several dozen active teams, covering every aspect of our organization and involving all levels of staffers as well as Board Members, volunteers and outside supporters. These free-floating and ad hoc teams have tapped a limitless well-spring of creativity while going far to

reduce the "turf battles" that are endemic to any complex organization.

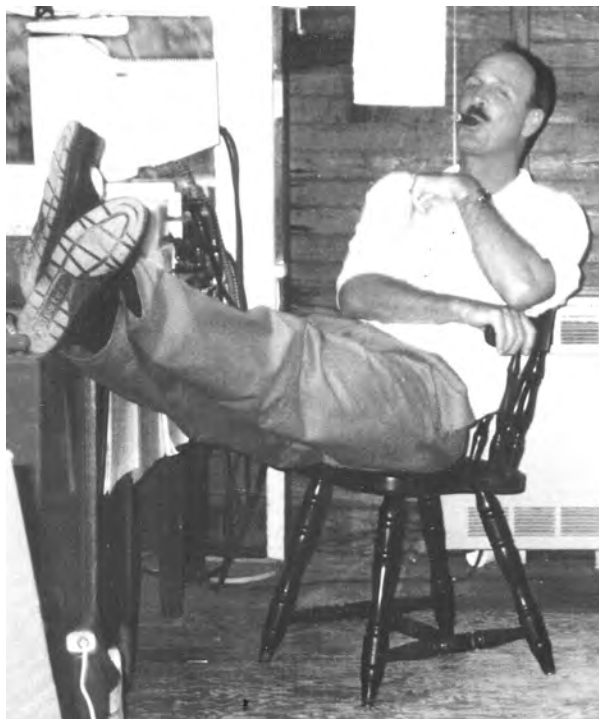
Construction Management. Early in his tenure at MAC, Bill stepped into the role of manager for all of our main construction projects. As such, he has ably served as the key interface between architects, contrac-

tors and MAC's leadership for the restoration of the Cape May Lighthouse interior and grounds, the Physick Estate grounds, the World War II Lookout Tower and numerous Designer Show Houses, while also laying the groundwork for our next major project – the air conditioning of the Physick house museum.

The Tearoom. If there's any MAC institution where Bill has left his indelible stamp, it's the Tearoom (originally the Twinings Tearoom, now the Carriage House Tearoom & Café). With professional training as a chef, Bill begged for the opportunity to create an in-house restaurant when we decided, in 1998, to create a food service in the newly restored Carriage House at the Physick Estate. From the menu, to the décor, to the level of service, to the special events, to how we structure our weddings – all are a reflection of Bill's intensive, hands-on supervision. If any of you have enjoyed a lunch, tea or party at the Tearoom over the past dozen years, you have Bill to thank for your happy experience.

Thanks to these many accomplishments, Bill Ten Eyck will be long remembered at MAC. Please join me in wishing him well and thanking him for a job superbly done.
